Mayor Eberline introduced Jay Duncan and Nathan Butler, Heart of Iowa, who provided an update on the fiber optic installation project. The majority of everything north of G Avenue is installed and working on commercial businesses along G Avenue alleys now. Plan is to have main lines done by the beginning of September and will continue with household installations.

Smith moved and Mcdonald seconded action on Resolution 2025-37, a resolution to accept the estimates from Axon Enterprises, Inc and Sector to retrofit the 2023 Dodge Charger police squad.

Chief Natvig explain the Axon Enterprises, Inc estimate is for camera installation for \$2751 per year and the Sector estimate is to install our used lights, sirens, miscellaneous equipment, and cage from the old squad to this one for \$11, 961.34. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes.

Kuester moved and Mcdonald seconded action on Resolution 2025-38, a resolution authorizing Mayor, and City Clerk to execute deed for alley east of 208 6th Street, Grundy Center. Sawyer explained this resolution is to complete the recording of this alley sale that occurred in October 2001. The property sold in January 2025 and was found to not have been recorded in 2001. No further discussion, motion carried four ayes.

Smith moved and Mcdonald seconded action on Resolution 2025-39, a resolution authorizing Mayor, and City Clerk

to execute deed for alley east of 204 6th Street, Grundy Center. No further discussions, motion carried four ayes. Mcdonald moved and Lamp seconded action to approve the appointment of Ron Dellit to the Library Board for another six-year term ending June 30, 2031. No further discussion, motion carried four ayes.

Mayor Eberline opened the discussion and update on food truck vendors and special event ordinances. Eberline ex-

plained the city is seeing more and more interest in food truck vendors attending events within the city limits. The food truck ordinance will include more specific definitions on food truck/trailer instead of including them under a peddler permit. In addition, an ordinance being considered where special events held within the city limits must have a permit prior to the event to ensure proper notification for street closures, food vendor permits, emergency planning processes, etc. These ordinances are to improve communication between hosting organizations and the city for better planning. Input and concerns from all interested parties are welcome. No further discussions, no formal action taken. Mayor Eberline opened a discussion on junk vehicles and race cars within city limits. Chapter 51 Junk and Junk Vehicles was distributed. Eberline commented that this a constant issue and asked if adding a clause to the ordinance to define a "racing season," for example, allowing race cars within the city limits from June through October and one week to remove or fines will be enforced. Lamp commented the race events are good for the town and bring in lots of revenue. Smith asked how to determine a definition for race cars, the junk vehicle definition pretty much currently covers it. Smith also commented adding "a season" will not help those residents that have to look at the junk vehicles constantly. Eberline asked for input from all those interested. No further discussion, no formal action taken. Mayor Eberline opened the public forum at 7:01 pm. Rich Ahlberg asked about the meeting minutes. No public comments, public forum closed at 7:04pm.

Finance Committee/Clerk made comments on city auditor will be here doing field work for fiscal year 2025 audit beginning September 15, 2025; updated code chapters were distributed; and beginning discussions with PRA Architects this week.

Public Safety Committee made comments on firearm training this week and new AED's devices have been received. Public Works Committee made no comments

Smith moved and Lamp seconded adjournment of the meeting at 7:10p.m. Motion carried four ayes. Next meeting will be Monday, August 18, 2025, at 6:30pm.

Mayor Kruse opened the discussion on a building permit application from Brandon and Tammy Lehr, 202 4 th Ave, for a 1900 sq ft garage addition. All building requirements and setbacks are met. Hansen moved and Claassen seconded action to approve the building permit for as written, motion carried five ayes.

Lennard moved and Claassen seconded action on Resolution 2025-14, a resolution to approve an application for the fire fighter roster. Mayor Kruse confirmed the background check has cleared. No further discussion, motion car-

Mayor Kruse opened a discussion on a new location for the city bus stop. Kruse spoke to family that donated the current bus stop structure, and they would like the plaque with their family name on it returned. Hansen mentioned a few other locations, such as front or rear of the city office building, the ball diamond or shelter house. Claassen acknowledged Fred Abels, bus driver for school district, to ask where he felt would be the best spot. Abels had no preference, just what to tell the family's before school starts in a couple of weeks. Discussion held about project for high school industrial arts class to construct a new three-sided structure. Claassen moved and Hansen seconded a motion to allow the bus stop to be out front of the City Office building until a structure is complete. No further discussion, motion carried five aves.

Mayor Kruse opened a discussion on recycling services and explained now may be a suitable time to complete the request for bids process for the service. Sawyer explained the previous audit showed concern that the city had not requested bids previously and the costs are above the \$2500 threshold limit. Sawyer explained a notice will be published in the Grundy Register, with bids due before 4pm on Wednesday, August 27, 2025. Bids will be opened after the deadline and Council will review them at next council meeting. Discussion was held on what the terms of a contract may be and how many residents use the service. Hansen moved and Holland seconded a motion to proceed with publishing a public notice to request for bids for a one- or three-year contract for recycling services. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes.

Council Member comments discussed several residents are blowing mown grass clippings onto city streets. According to the Code of Ordinance, Chapter 135.03, residents shall not place any grass on city streets as it will wash into the storm and sanitary sewer mains.

Hansen moved and Holland seconded adjournment of the meeting at 7:50pm. Motion carried five ayes. Next regular meeting will be Tuesday, September 2, 2025, at 7pm. Charles Kruse, Mayor
